489 Households will have Unique Vegetable Storage Cellars

The 'Community Based Garden Management' project staff conducted 'Cellar building methodologies' training for their beneficiaries from August 20-30. The main aim of the training session was to provide technical support so that beneficiaries can store their produce in cellar's for seed storage from the harvest this Autumn.

There are several special features of this kind of cellar compared to regular cellars, such as: it is built under the house or ger (traditional felt house) floor, thus keeping the temperature of the cellar warmer, there is a ventilation channel installed, and the cellar is also covered by cement walls.

With a total capacity of 2.5m³, the cellar is able to hold up to 500kg worth of vegetables at one time. The cement and ventilation channels which are required for these unique cellars are provided by the project, and the other materials are obtained by the beneficiaries. The project aims to have completed the construction of 489 cellars before the harvest period. This project is funded by ADRA Australia.
